# **Indigenous Cultural Competency Online Training**

#### BACKGROUND

Indigenous Cultural Competency (ICC) training will be of interest to health care and allied professionals who work directly and indirectly with Indigenous people. This unique facilitated on-line cultural competency training course is designed to increase knowledge, enhance self-awareness and build on skills.

Created in response to British Columbia's Transformative Change Accord First Nations Health Plan, training addresses the requirement to increase cultural competency within Health. In just under three years over 7000 of our target 100,000 BC health care providers have taken ICC.

The training is intended to strengthen individual competencies in three key areas: knowledge, self awareness, and cultural competency skills development.

The curriculum is foundational training, and and can supplement additional region or nation specific training offered by Indigenous groups or regional health authorities

#### **CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION**

### Format

Online discussions, interactive activities, videos and contributions between peers and the facilitation team provide rich learning opportunities to expand and share information. Pre- and post-knowledge quizzes assist participants in assessing their learning.
